

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Lifesaver Training

In 2019 all City of Albuquerque Employees were trained by Albuquerque Fire and Rescue to EMTs and Paramedics on the following techniques:

- Empower participants to save the lives of the wounded
- Obtain basic understanding of anatomy as it pertains to bleeding control
- Be able to identify life threatening injuries
- Understand and apply basic bleeding control measures
- Understand and apply basic airway and breathing techniques
- Be able to recognize and prevent hypothermia
- Save their own life using their new knowledge
- Understand and perform hands only CPR
- Understand and use an AED
- Be able to recognize an opioid overdose and
- administer the antidote






Why teach these skills?

- Uncontrolled bleeding is a major cause of preventable death.
- The average time to bleed out from a major artery is 2-5 minutes.
- Sudden cardiac arrest is a leading cause of death, effecting more than 420,000 people annually outside of the hospital in the US.
- 50% of these victims die before reaching the hospital.
- Cardiac arrest survival rates dramatically increase with hands only CPR.





HEMOSTATIC GAUZE **EMERGENCY BANDAGE**



Place gauze on wound and continue to apply pressure for 3 minutes or until bleeding stops.

TOURNIQUET

Wrap the wound w ent pad, inset ela secure with c

COMPRESSED GAUZE



Route and band around the limb, and pass the tip through the gaps for the buckle Position the tourniquet 2-3" above the wound site.






