

## **Policies to advance recycling**



2007: Resource Recovery Economic Opportunity fund

**2017-22:** State of Recycling in CO reports

2019: State Legislative committee to study zero waste solutions

2019: Front Range Waste Diversion Fund

2020: Law to study EPR opportunities & Governor declares CO Recycles Week

2022: Laws to create Circular Economy Development Center & Producer Responsibility for Recycling for Packaging and Paper



#### COLORADO

Department of Public Health & Environment RREO (2007 & 2013) Resource Recovery and Economic Opportunity Fund



House Bill 07-1288 & Senate Bill 13-050:

- Created funding for the RREO Grant and Rebate program
- Program is funded through tipping fees
- \$0.14 per cubic yard of solid waste
- Generates ~\$4 million of annual revenue for the program





**FRWD** Front Range Waste Diversion



- SB19-192 established a per-ton fee on waste disposed of in landfills within the Front Range. (\$0.60/ton in 2023; annually adjusted)
- This enterprise fund is administered by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment and a 13-member volunteer Board of Directors.
- Grants and Technical Assistance are provided within the front range to support effective waste reduction and diversion solutions.

### Waste Diversion & Circular Economy (HB22-1159)



The Circular Economy Development Center is a program of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment aimed at empowering and facilitating connections between sectors in Colorado and regionally to create circular economy solutions using materials that Coloradans recycle.

## MAIN GOALS

#### **Create New Markets**

Materials that currently have no market nationally Or materials that may have a market somewhere but are going 100% to landfill in Colorado

**Expand Existing Markets** 

Materials that have an established market But most of the material is currently leaving Colorado

## Colorado Producer Responsibility Program (HB22 – 1355)



- Producers (Brands) pay dues to Producer
   Responsibility Program (PRO), based on the amount and type of material sold in Colorado
- PRO creates an accepted materials list
- PRO pays private companies and local governments to operate recycling and processing programs
- PRO covers 100% of costs, including education
- Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment will oversee PRO
- Advisory Board helps PRO meet the needs of communities and businesses

## The program is designed to:





Develop a convenient, cost-effective statewide recycling system with free recycling to all residents that funds ALL aspects of the recycling process



Be funded and managed by producers who sell packaging and paper in and into the state



Set up an industry-run program with appropriate government oversight and advisory board of key stakeholders







The law will save local governments money by reimbursing their costs to run recycling programs. How will the producer responsibility program in Colorado work?

Companies selling packaging and paper join Producer Responsibility Organization (PRO)

Producers pay dues to the non-profit PRO or submit their own individual plan.

PRO develops plan to improve recycling statewide.

Advisory board reviews plan; CDPHE approves program and enforces participation

PRO contracts with service providers to provide convenient recycling at no charge to all residents.

## PRO REIMBURSES FOR 100% OF RECYCLING COSTS




- All single-family and multi-family residents throughout Colorado
- May expand to schools, parks, small businesses after 2028

#### **Colorado Producer Responsibility Advisory Board**



### ROLE OF ADVISORY BOARD



Advise the PRO and CDPHE during the Needs Assessment

Advise the PRO on the scenarios created (3 minimum)

Recommend to CDPHE to approve/reject the preferred scenario

Consult with PRO on minimum recyclables list

Continue to advise PRO and CDPHE as the program plan is developed



August - November 2023	<ul> <li>PRO contracted with HDR Engineering and Eunomia to conduct Needs Assessment</li> <li>Sector webinars and surveys are starting in September</li> </ul>
November December 2023	<ul> <li>Finalize Needs Assessment</li> <li>Create 3 possible scenarios for implementing program and setting diversion goals</li> </ul>
January 2024	<ul> <li>PRO consults with Advisory Board to determine plan based on needs assessment</li> <li>PRO presents Needs Assessment and Program Plan to CDPHE by January 30, 2024</li> <li>Advisory Board recommends to approve/reject plan to CDPHE</li> </ul>
March 2024	<ul> <li>CDPHE presents plan to Colorado's Joint Budget Committee (bi-partisan) for final approval by March 14, 2024</li> </ul>
Sphing 2025- 2029	<ul> <li>PRO implements approved plan</li> <li>Consults with Advisory Board to compose annual reports to CDPHE</li> <li>Needs Assessment repeated every 5 years</li> </ul>
