Attendees that choose the urban track will learn why the City of Santa Fe recently switched to a four-day collection schedule from Santa Fe's Environmental Services Division Director, Shirlene Sitton in her, "Route optimization, Collections & Related Education in the City of Santa Fe," presentation. This presentation will delve into the City's recent route optimization project, subsequent collection changes and related outreach efforts. Catelyn Scholwinski, Senior Consultant at NewGen Strategies & Solutions, will present, "Maximizing Opportunities and Managing Challenges in Residential Collection," a case study from Avondale, Arizona. Under the strain of rapid growth, this town of about 90,000 residents evaluated potential operational changes to manage growth and continue to provide quality

service to customers. The presentation will demonstrate how field observations, operational scenarios, growth modelling, and survey data combined to provide city leaders a comparative outlook of capital, operational, and labor costs across different scenarios for garbage and recycling collection and for bulky items collection.

Dave Yanke, President of NewGen Strategies and Solutions, LLC, will take a deep dive into, "Solid Waste Services - When to Municipalize, When to Privatize and How to Know What to Do." Recently Yanke's company conducted numerous studies for municipal clients to assist them in evaluating various services - commercial collection, landfill operations, as well as MRF operations, with the goal of helping the city determine whether they should provide the service themselves (i.e. municipalize), or to privatize it. #### Reduce, Reuse, Recycle—Roxy Room

We all know the waste management hierarchy and mantra of, "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle," but HOW we go about doing these things varies widely in terms of actions and efficacy. In this session Jalal Rastegary, a Research Scientist at New Mexico State University, will discuss the "Impact of New Mexico Pollution Prevention and Source Reduction Program." NMSU's College of Engineering provides free, on-sight pollution prevention, energy efficiency and environmental assessment services to NM businesses. Attendees will learn how these efforts have led to a reduction in CO2 emissions by 105,931 metric tons, hazardous waste use by 18,996 tons, energy reduction by 64,434,340 kWh, water conservation of 102,137,645 gallons and cost savings of \$23,758,338 within the past five years. After we reduce pollution and waste at its source, the next step is REUSE. Scott Guffey, Operations Supervisor at Estancia Valley Solid Waste Authority will present on, "Estancia Valley's Swap Shop: Case Study on Public Reuse Areas." The popular reuse area is valued by the community, helps to keep items out of the landfill, and provides useful material to community members. Scott will share lessons learned related to operations

of a successful reuse center. Ernie Rodarte, Senior Project Manager at PNM Resources, will wrap up the session with, "PNM's Green Team Efforts to Increase Recycling and Reuse." Learn about the new programs the Green Team recently implemented to increase recycling and reuse at PNM's locations across the state.

#### Landfill Management—Baldwin Room

Ray Huff, Vice President at SCS Engineers, draws upon over 30 years of expertise to discuss, "An Update on WAG Implementation: An Innovation in Landfill Gas Data Analysis." The history of LFG data analysis has ranged from tables to single-parameter graphs, and eventually to multi-parameter graphs. Learn how Mr. Huff and his team evaluated alternatives to the standard multi-parameter line graphs and developed a multi-parameter, multi-well ternary scatter plot, providing multiple parameters of data for an entire wellfield, on a single graph to evaluate the health/compliance of a wellfield more efficiently. Michael Richardson, from Triad Industrial Consulting, highlights, "On Board Oil Recycling Systems - Reduce oil use and maintenance costs," to explain how bypass filtration can double equipment life, and, cut lubrication needs (and therefore expenses) in half. "Lessons Learned from the Partial Closure of the Cerro Colorado Landfill," will be shared by Tom Parker, Project Director at SCS Engineers. The Cerro Colorado landfill is the cornerstone of the City of Albuquerque's integrated system that manages the disposal of approximately 600,000 tons of MSW per year. The City recently closed approximately 30 acres of the site by installing an evapotranspiration cover, stormwater channels, and an innovative vegetative layer. This presentation will summarize the closure process, construction activities, benefits of partially closing landfill areas, and lessons learned.
